## The Carver Center

The George Washington Carver School opened in 1948 as the first modern elementary school for African Americans in Loudoun County and closed in 1968.

The newly restored Carver Center now serves as a senior center and adult day care center on weekdays and is available for general community use on evenings and weekends.

## Directions to Carver Center:

From points east, take Route 7 west toward Winchester. Take the VA-287 ramp toward VA-7-BR/Purcellville/Lovettsville. Turn left onto Berlin Turnpike / VA-287. Turn right onto E Main St. Proceed 1.2 miles. Turn left onto S Nursery Ave and immediately take the left fork onto S. 20th Street. Proceed .5 mile and turn left onto Willie Palmer Way.
